Girls in the Game Donor Privacy Policy

Girls in the Game is committed to respecting the privacy of our donors.

Information Collected. Here are the types of donor information that we collect and maintain:

- contact information: name, organization/company, complete address, phone number, email address
- donation information: amounts donated, date of donation(s), method and stimulus
- information concerning hours you have volunteered
- your requests and comments
- information gathered from database modeling firms
- non-personally identifiable information, such as how many hits each Girls in the Game website page or social media platform receives, and if the visitor is repeat or new. This requires that a 'cookie' be sent to your web browser.

How Information is Used. Girls in the Game uses donor data to maintain records of donations, send acknowledgements, mail year-end tax statements to you, send newsletters, notices and direct mail pieces, and for internal marketing purposes. We normally add donors to our mailing list, unless they request otherwise. Our third-party mailing service is contractually obligated to treat the lists with confidentiality and is prohibited from transferring them elsewhere. Corporate and Foundation funders and sponsors as well as individual donors are listed in our Annual Report and relevant event materials. We use written comments/letters/emails from donors occasionally to post on our website (in an anonymous fashion or with names with donor permission), and to respond to donor inquiries. Credit card numbers are NOT retained once processed. Our website has an SSL certificate. Donations over 2% of our entire budget must be reported on IRS Form 990, Schedule B. We use website statistics to analyze our website usage.

No Sharing of Personal Information. Girls in the Game will not sell, rent, trade, or transfer personal information to outside organizations. Use of donor information will be limited to the internal purposes of Girls in the Game and only to further the mission of Girls in the Game. Nevertheless, security measures may not prevent all losses, and Girls in the Game is not responsible for any damages or liabilities relating to security failures.
